Dr. Guy Brown

Dr. Guy Brown is a Senior Executive Coach for Ethos Leadership Group, LLC, an executive coaching and employee training consultancy with clients from corporate businesses, institutions of higher learning, non-profit organizations, and political campaigns.

Guy is a Fellow of the Dallas Institute for Humanities and Culture, in Dallas, where he has both taught in the Teachers' Academy and lectured publicly, and serves as a professor of philosophy and literature at Lubbock Christian University, in Lubbock, where he also offers courses in the Honors Program. Guy also serves as director of The Straight Gate, a 3-acre 18 duplex-unit 501 (c) 3 charitable non-profit project for residential recovery and prison aftercare in the South Oak Cliff neighborhood of the Dallas-Ft. Worth area. He also manages agricultural and oil and gas interests in west Texas.

Guy was appointed by President Reagan to be head of the US Information Agency's international book publishing, library, and English teaching programs from 1982-1988, where he arranged for the publication of the *Federalist Papers* and other titles in Russian, Spanish, Hindi, and other languages, and led negotiations between US publishers and Soviet, East German, and Chinese publishing authorities.

Guy received the *Gutenberg Award* at the Frankfurt International Book Fair and was awarded the *Ivan Fedorov Medal* by the Soviet Government and the *Benjamin Franklin Distinguished Service Medal* by the US Government Printing Office. He received the *Distinguished Service Award* from the J.W. Fulbright Board of Foreign Scholarships in 1992 for his work as head of the international Fulbright scholarships, the world's largest scholarly exchanges, and academic programs from 1988-1992, where he was also lead negotiator for the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs on all US government bilateral cultural programming under the Geneva Convention.

Guy is the author of *Calhoun's Philosophy of Politics: a Study of a Disquisition on Government* (2000) and *Shakespeare's Philosopher King: Reading "The Tragedy of King Lear"* (2010), both from Mercer University Press. His studies of Henry VI and Henry VIII are forthcoming.

Guy earned his Ph.D. from the Institute of Philosophical Studies at the University of Dallas.
